EDLER HAWKINS CIVIL ACTIVIST WITH HIS MINISTRY

Edler Garnett Hawkins was born on this date in 1908. He was an African American minister and civil rights activist through the Presbyterian

Hawkins, born in the Bronx, New York, was the son of Albert and Annie Lee Hawkins. He received his bachelor of divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary in 1938. Hawkins became the first pastor of Saint Augustine Presbyterian Church in the Bronx. In 1964, he became the first African-American moderator of the General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church. As a member of the Presbyterian Interracial Council, Hawkins promoted involvement in the Civil Rights Movement.

He retired in 1970 to join the faculty of Princeton Theological Seminary as professor of Black studies. Edler Hawkins died on December 18, 1977.





hen Prathia Hall ('82B, '84M, '97D) was a little girl, not tall enough to look over the top of the lectern in Mount Sharon Baptist Church in north Philadelphia,

adults in the congregation lifted her up to stand on a chair or table so that she could read Scripture during the Sunday services. She was encouraged early on to make full use of one of the talents that God blessed her with—her speaking voice.

How surprised and delighted the members of that small congregation (some of whom probably remember her as a youth) were when, last year, Hall was named the top African American woman preacher by Ebony magazine!
